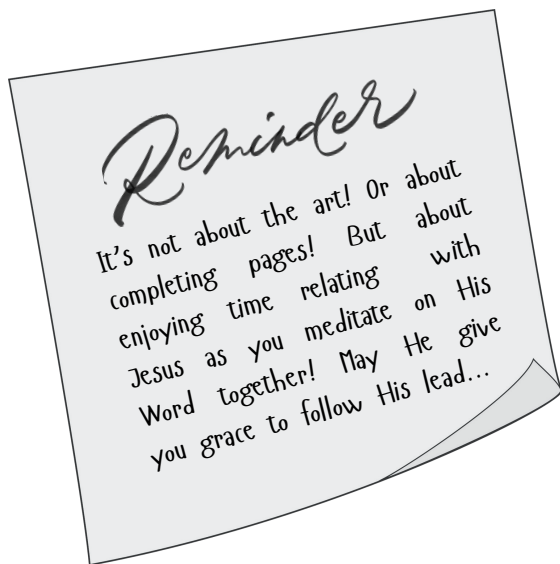

The Heart of Prayer

Whatever You Wish?

In John 15:7 Jesus makes a shocking statement, “if you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish and it will be done for you.” What, wait? Whatever you wish? How can that be?

Remember, the enemy loves to take God’s Word and twist it, so we will think it means something different than what God intends and assume the Lord isn’t faithful or good when He doesn’t do what we expect. This is why it is vital to take time to understand what God is saying... and isn’t.

Remember, you must read Scripture in context - and that doesn’t only mean the verses before and directly after the verse but the whole context of Scripture.

We are told in Matthew 7:11, “If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!” and in James 1:17 “Every good and perfect gift comes from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights who does not change like shifting shadows.” God gives good gifts. So what happens if we ask for something that isn’t good?

When Amy Carmichael was a little girl she asked God to give her blue eyes like her mothers and was so disappointed when he never did. But years later when the Lord led her to be a missionary in India, rescuing children from being used as temple prostitutes, Amy was able to go undercover to find details of these children because she had brown eyes. Staining her arms with coffee and wearing full Indian dress, she could disguise herself as an Indian woman and move freely in Indian society - something she never could’ve done if God had given her the blue eyes she asked for. With her brown eyes and the all wise, all powerful God, she helped save over one thousand children!

If...

When reading this verse it can be easy to jump to "whatever you wish" and start asking away and forget this promise is conditional. John 15:7 begins with a conditional word, "if." That means we have a part to play. Before we can ask whatever we wish and it be done for us, we need to abide in the Lord and His Word needs to abide in us.

What do you think it looks like to do this?

Remember how Romans 12:2 tells us "Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing, you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." Our minds are renewed as we spend time with Jesus, enabling us to better know what His will is and pray in accordance.

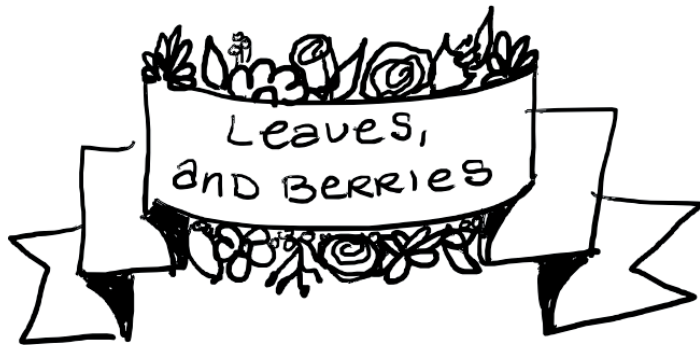
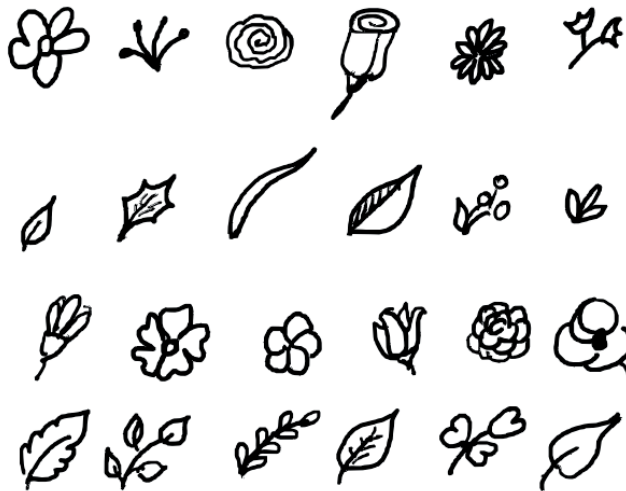
Proverbs 13:20 points out we become like those we spend the most time with. Spend time with Jesus then you will start to want what he wants and ask for what is good. And God's Word is key for us enjoying time with Him.

Of course, Scripture memory can get God's Word into our minds. But the Greek word for abide transliterated meno means to be present. I find a lot of the verses I've memorized I rarely even think of, let alone live present to.

But when I memorize to music and review on repeat while I exercise - that's when I find I am more present to God's Word - even when I wake at 3 in the morning it is playing in the backdrop of my mind! Fighter verses has a great song if you want to memorize John 15:7 in the ESV!

One other thing that's really helped - About twenty years ago I decided to start memorizing the prayers in Scripture. I was blown away by how handy it was when praying for people to pray these.

If someone was struggling with a relationship with a roommate, spouse or friend, I'd pray Romans 15:5-6. If someone was feeling discouraged, I'd pray Romans 15:13. If someone was facing a decision and didn't know what to do, I'd pray Colossians 1:9-12. If someone was struggling with feeling unloved (and that is often an underlying reason behind a ton of sin), I'd pray Ephesians 3:14-21.

After reading Jerry Bridges' article Engaging the Unseen Foe I started to pray scripture for friends who don't know Jesus. I was amazed at how impactful it was to do this.

Want to know the best part of praying Scripture?
There is never a doubt whether I am praying God's will for something!

I also find praying straight through chapters and books in the Bible gives me so many ideas for new things to pray for and can serve as such a wonderful guide.

What can it look like for you to let God's Word abide in you?
How can doing this impact your praying?

Praying In A Way that Honors Christ As The Center of Everything

There are many different ways to pray. In fact, before you even start this week, I encourage you to take out the “pantry” you created last week and on the shelf marked prayer label boxes and bowls representing the resources and tools that have helped you learn how to pray, then have fun asking others what has helped them learn how to pray and continue pressing on in prayer.

Have fun with this! One of the things that encourages and spurs me on in prayer are the stories of how other people have experienced God answering prayers. This past week my husband and I watched the movie *Unsung Hero* - there are so many answered prayers in that movie. You better believe it has spurred me on to pray even more and to worship our amazing God. He really does write the best stories.

But it also encourages me in a huge way when I take time to remember the stories in my life where I prayed and then experienced the Lord answering (both when He gave me what I asked for as well as when he didn't, but instead gave me what my heart really longed for).

There are many different ways to do each "finger" but this is a great way to remember the five main categories of prayer. Sometimes it can be easy to get stuck just using one finger instead of the full repertoire the Lord's blessed us with.

As we dive into this week, I encourage you to enjoy time with Jesus praying through the prayer hand and see if there's anything you've been missing that could enrich your interactions with Jesus even more.

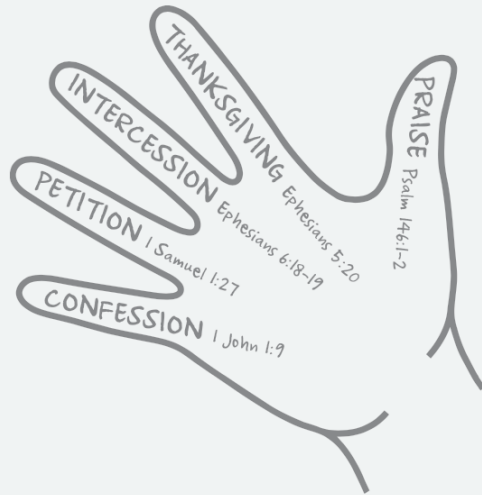

Navigators Discipleship Tool

Many believers find extended time in prayer a difficult spiritual discipline. Here's an easy way to remember five essential aspects of prayer. Pray through each of these five aspects, remembering that prayer is really about aligning our hearts with God's, and as the fifth aspect explains below, praises to God should permeate every part.



THE PRAYER HAND

- ① **CONFESSION**
I agree with God about my sin.
"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."
1 John 1:9
- ② **PETITION**
I ask God to provide for my needs.
"I prayed for this child, and the Lord has granted me what I asked of him."
1 Samuel 1:27
- ③ **INTERCESSION**
I ask God to provide for the needs of others.
"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel..."
Ephesians 6:18-19
- ④ **THANKSGIVING**
I thank God for what He has done in, through, and for me. I thank Him for His answers to prayers in the lives of those around me and for His ongoing work across the nation and the world.
"...always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."
Ephesians 5:20
- ⑤ **PRAISE**
I let my enjoyment and adoration of God overflow into words. As the thumb is able to touch all four other fingers, so praise should permeate every part of my prayer life.

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. **2** Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. **3** Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. **4** Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. **5** I am the vine; you are the branches. 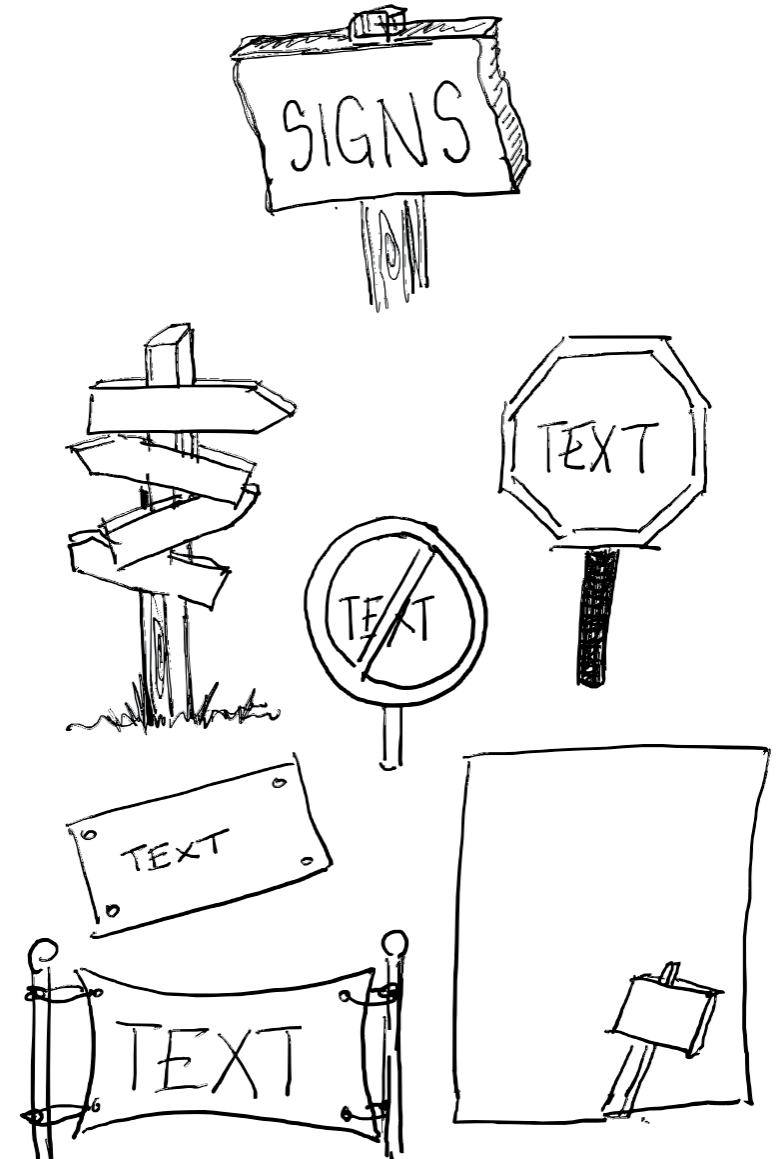

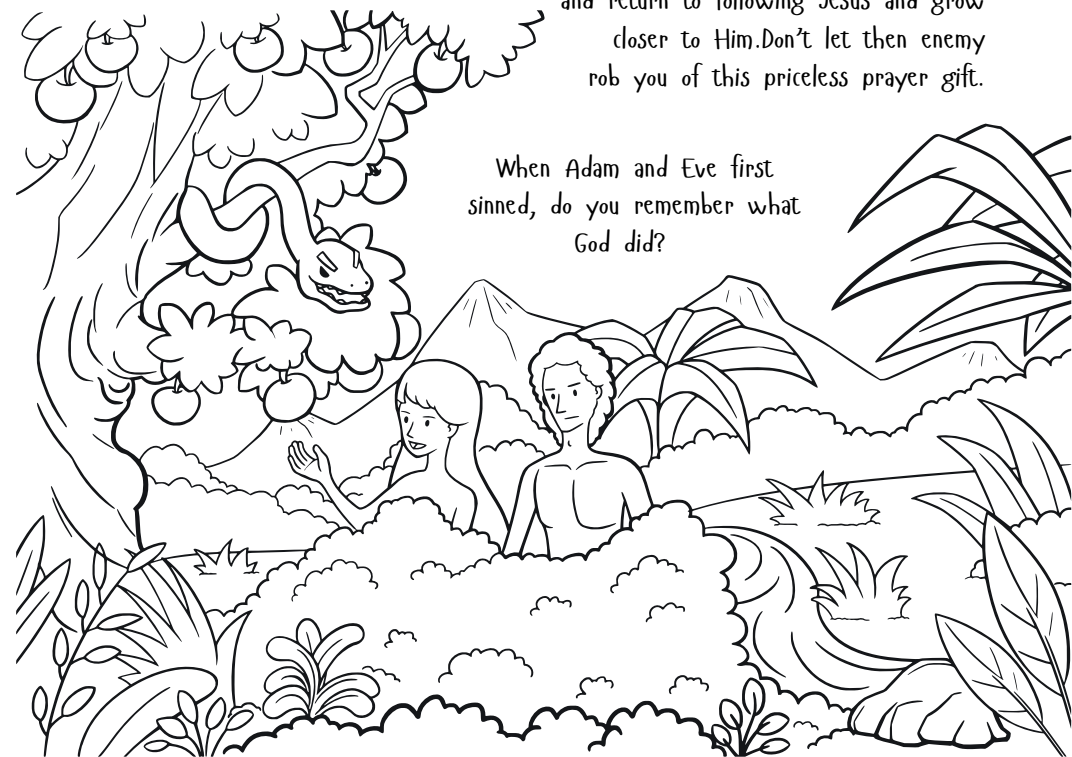

Prayer Gift #1: Confession

What is this that you have done?

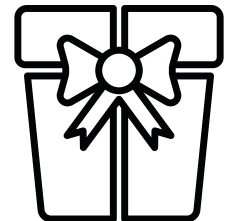

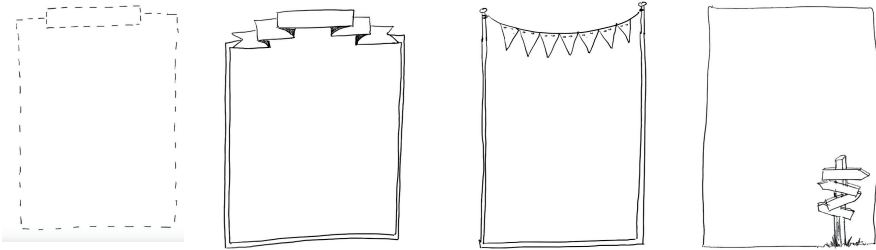

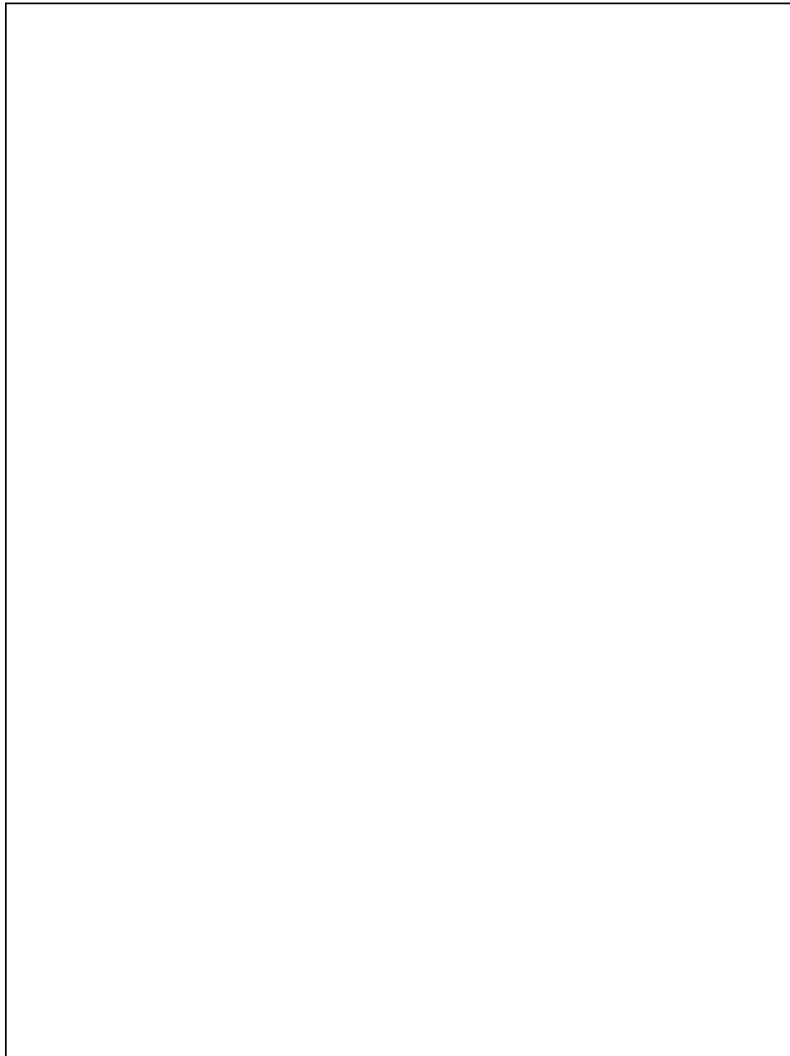
Consider A Quote

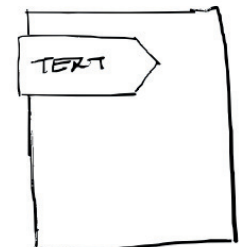

Day 6: "and it will be done"

Consider Context In Another Translation

I am the Real Vine and my Father is the Farmer. He cuts off every branch of me that doesn't bear grapes. And every branch that is grape-bearing he prunes back so it will bear even more. You are already pruned back by the message I have spoken.

LOOK:

4 "Live in me. Make your home in me just as I do in you. In the same way that a branch can't bear grapes by itself but only by being joined to the vine, you can't bear fruit unless you are joined with me.

LISTEN:

5-8 "I am the Vine, you are the branches. When you're joined with me and I with you, the relation intimate and organic, the harvest is sure to be abundant. Separated, you can't produce a thing. Anyone who separates from me is deadwood, gathered up and thrown on the bonfire. But if you make yourselves at home with me and my words are at home in you, you can be sure that whatever you ask will be listened to and acted upon. This is how my Father shows who he is—when you produce grapes, when you mature as my disciples.

9-10 "I've loved you the way my Father has loved me. Make yourselves at home in my love. If you keep my commands, you'll remain intimately at home in my love. That's what I've done—kept my Father's commands and made myself at home in his love.

11-15 "I've told you these things for a purpose: that my joy might be your joy, and your joy wholly mature. This is my command: Love one another the way I loved you. This is the very best way to love. Put your life on the line for your friends. You are my friends when you do the things I command you. I'm no longer calling you servants because servants don't understand what their master is thinking and planning. No, I've named you friends because I've let you in on everything I've heard from the Father.

LIVE IT OUT:

16 "You didn't choose me, remember; I chose you, and put you in the world to bear fruit, fruit that won't spoil. As fruit bearers, whatever you ask the Father in relation to me, he gives you.

17 "But remember the root command: Love one another.

- Wars to cease - people to discover true peace in Jesus
- Safety from violence - Protection for believers who live in closed countries

They followed the Lord's banner into battle and the banner reminded them He was how they won!

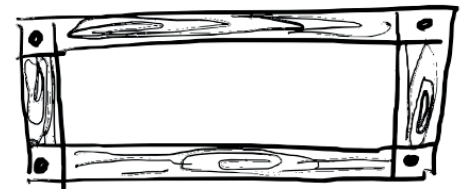
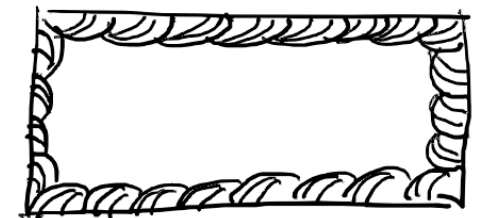
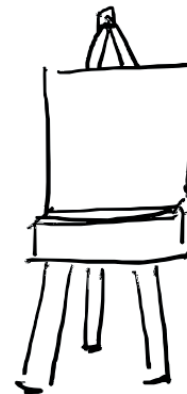
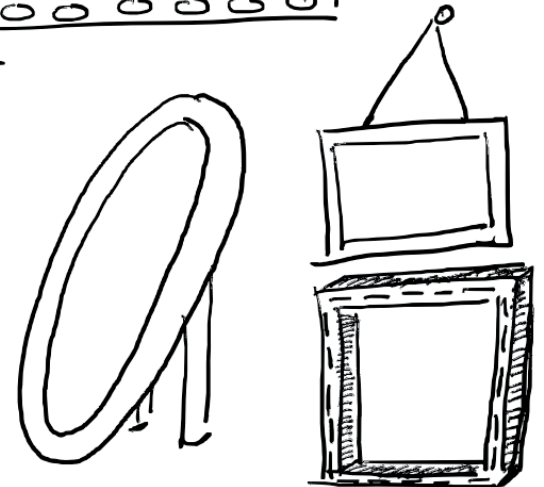
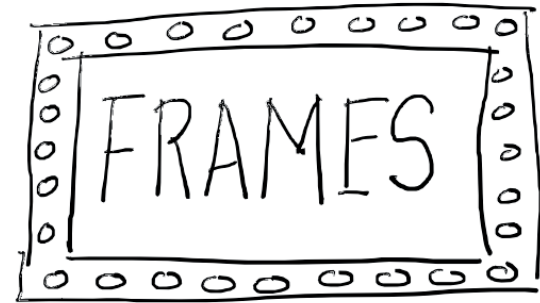
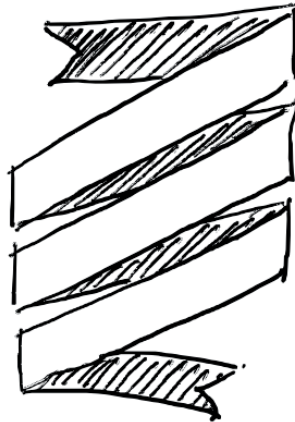
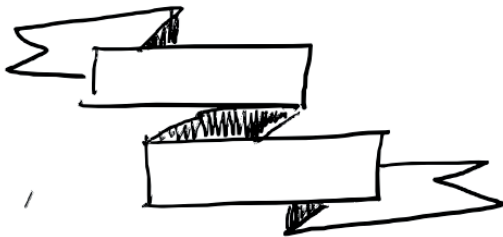
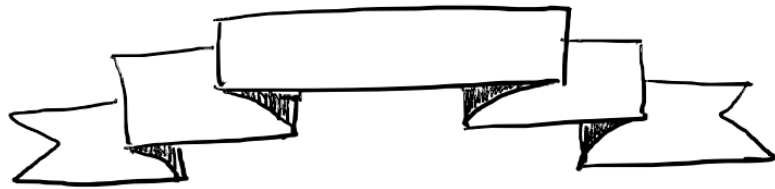
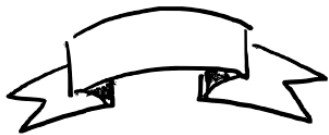
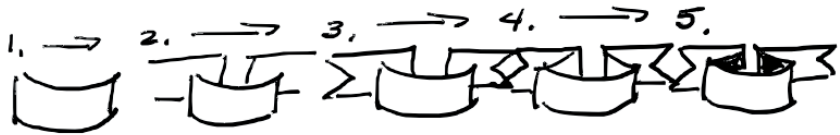
Symbol of Commitment:

Raising a banner was a symbol of commitment and loyalty to a leader or cause.

Day 3: “and”

Conjunction Changes

Scrolls In the Bible

Scrolls were the “books” of the day back in Old and New Testament times. People wrote things on scrolls that they wanted to remember. There are so many fascinating references to scrolls in the Bible. God has John, Jeremiah and Ezekiel all eat scrolls which taste sweet at first and then turn bitter in their mouths.

Scrolls are often a symbol for God’s Word since that is what God’s Word was originally written on (ever heard of the Dead Sea Scrolls?). But they can also be a symbol for wisdom and a scroll with both ends facing up is often used as a symbol for life unfolding.

In Revelation 5 John sees a scroll with seven seals in God’s hand and weeps when no one is found worthy to open it - but then Jesus is revealed as the only one who can and when he does God’s judgment is released.

Scrolls can be a lot of fun to draw and create a perfect space on which to record a one word or short phrase summary of the treasure Jesus blesses you with as you enjoy time with Him today.

On the next page you will find examples of different ways you can draw scrolls. Have fun practicing them and then select one to add to today’s creative meditation page.

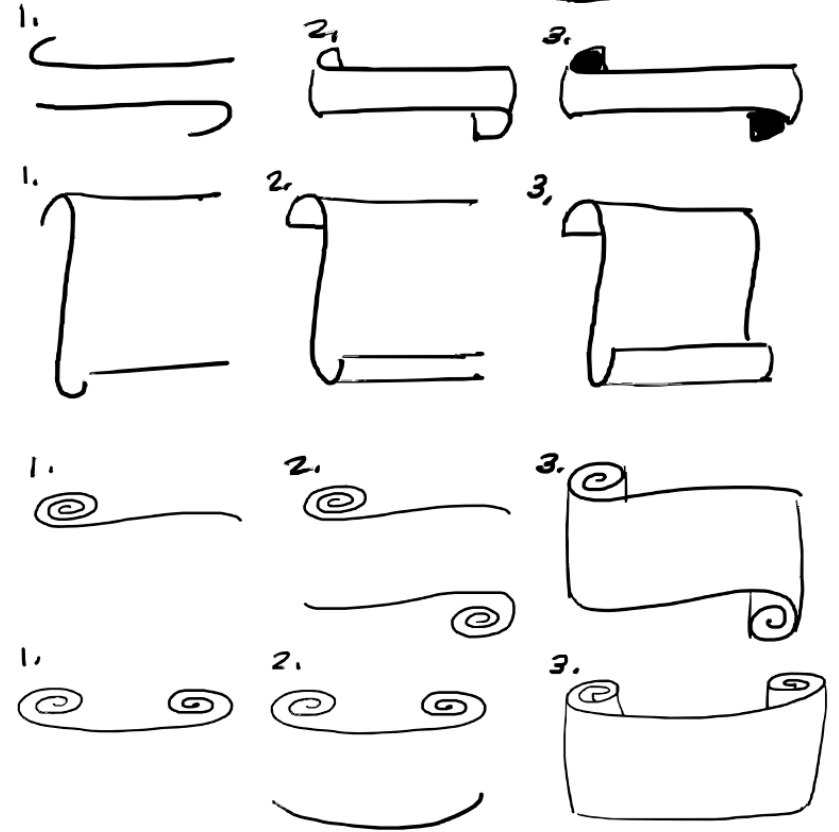

Scripture Memory Review

“Many a Christian has found that when he began to commit Scripture portions to memory, he also began to overcome in daily temptations. This is why Satan will try to keep you from hiding God’s Word in your heart. He knows how effective it is (Hebrews 4:12)...It is not that the mere quoting of Scripture brings victory. Satan himself quoted Scripture, but he misused it in order to deceive (Matthew 4:6; Psalm 91:11,12). In the verse, “Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee,” note that the Word of God is the means to victory, not an unconditional guarantee that one will overcome temptation... When we use the Word of God in meeting temptation, we must use it in faith - dependence on the power of God behind His Word to fulfill it (Ephesians 6:16). If the word of God is in our lives and hidden in our hearts, our faith is strengthened, “Faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.” (Romans 10:17. Thus God’s Word builds our faith; and used in faith to meet temptation, it gives victory.”

Prayer Gift #3: Praying Passages

In 2 Timothy 3:16 we are told “All Scripture is useful for teaching, rebuking, correction, and training in righteousness...” Did you know all Scripture is also useful for praying?

I will never forget meeting Barbara Jabbour, an older woman on staff with The Navigators who shared she and her prayer partner met every week to pray their way through the Bible. You can take any passage and as you are reading talk about it with Jesus, share whatever comes to mind that relates to the verse you just read. It is an incredible way to dialogue with the Lord. Like Barbara, you can start in Genesis and pray your way straight through - and then start all over again. When I met Barbara they had prayed through the entire Bible three times!. My prayer partner and I started doing this and it has revolutionized the way we pray! Want to give it a try? Why not start with John 15:1-7

- 1 “I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser.
- 2 Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit.
- 3 Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you.
- 4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me.
- 5 I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.
- 6 If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned.
- 7 If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you.
