





FELLOWSHIP:

Fighting Together for Joy

(aka acknowledging Christ is the Center of everything)

The purpose of the four spokes in the Navigator Wheel Illustration is to help us honor Christ as the Center of everything. It is especially important to keep this in mind when considering fellowship. Much of what passes for fellowship in the church today can easily serve to draw us away from this. Many churches have “connect” groups. What connection are they aiming for? I suspect for many people the goal is to connect with other believers. Sadly, if that is the primary intent, people will miss out on the goodness and beauty and depth the Lord intends for them even in their relationships with each other.



The Greek word that is used when you read the word fellowship in your Bible is usually the word transliterated koinonia. The meaning of this word goes much deeper than what my picture represents. Koinonia is not only a coming together casually, but a participation, a connection that takes place where there is a contribution, a sharing, an involvement taking place deep inside you.

One of the ways this word can be interpreted is social intercourse, where you're not only talking, you're taking in what someone says and they're taking in what you say in a way that penetrates the depths of both of you.

This term first occurs in the book of Acts after there is an explosion of growth in the early church. After thousands of people came to know Jesus, many while they were far from their homes, the believers lived together, shared life together, and had things in common. There was a real involvement in one another's lives as they cared for each other.

This went far beyond the transfer of ideas or only spending time together.

The term Koinonia predates its biblical usage and appears in a number of ways. One way was commercially, like if two guys were to go out and they were to buy a boat together, and start a fishing business together. They were actually said to be in Koinonia. That was their business partnership that they were sharing together.

Marriage was another way that the ancient Greeks used this term of Koinonia because it pointed to the sharing of two lives together. Another way that it's used was in relationship to the gods like Zeus. The fourth way koinonia was used was to refer to the spirit of generous sharing.

When Paul used the term Koinonia and when Luke used it in writing the book of Acts, it denoted something so much richer, a type of deep involvement. Thanks to the fall, this doesn't come naturally to us.

Have you ever been in a group of believers and it felt shallow? Where maybe you came to the group feeling alone, and you walked away from the group feeling even more alone.

True fellowship requires a level of intentionality, which is why we're instructed in Hebrews 10:24 -25, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

This week we are going to camp out Matthew 18:20. "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I with them." Isn't neat how this verse really captures the heart of fellowship - Jesus being the center!

Before diving in, why not enjoy some fellowship with the Lord and ask Him to bless your ears to hear all He wants you to?

True fellowship may or may not occur at a potluck, but a potluck can be a powerful metaphor illustrating a key aspect of koinonia.

I'm from the south. When we have potlucks down here, people tend to go all out cooking their best dishes, they bring them and I'm telling you it is a feast to enjoy. Before they ever come together, people invest time and energy, and they have put a lot of intentionality into preparing something to bless the other people who will be around them.

In 1 Corinthians 14:26 believers are instructed, when you come together, one person should bring a hymn, another bring a lesson,, someone else may bring a revelation or whatever treasure God has given and everything is to be done for the purpose of edification.

Every believer is to bring something
because every believer has something of value to offer.

I find if I try to flourish an entire verse it's too much. But I learned from my friend Debbie Friley to just do one or a few of the words and can that ever add fun, whimsy and sometimes even beauty to my meditations.


Even professional calligraphers play around with the words and try different combinations and designs before they settle on the final result you see. It took a number of attempts before I came up with what's below.

If you don't have a lot of time just give it a go with a pen and remember it's not about the final result. But if you have time, trying different combinations using a pencil can actually provide some really sweet time with Jesus. Just add swirls to the spaces created between letters that ascend or descend. And if you ask Jesus to give you ideas and guide you in this, you just might be amazed at what results!

This is why we've been doing the pantry exercise. As you take time to add to your pantry what's helped you grow in understanding and experiencing true fellowship, this can enrich your discipling so you can easily see what God's blessed you with that can be passed on.



For example, in my Pantry on the Fellowship shelf, in addition to my Special Treasures bookmark for Shared Quiet Times, I have a Forgiveness booklet, a bookmark on how to apologize, Ken Sande's book The Peacemaker as well as his wife's curriculum for children (that I use even with college students), The Lost Art of Listening by Michael P. Nichols, my booklet Journey to Hear, Thanks for the Feedback and it's accompanying Bible study, as well as Dr. Harriet Lerner's book Why Won't You Apologize.

In his book True Community: The Biblical Practice of Koinonia, Jerry Bridges writes: "One of the plainest expressions of love in Scripture is fellowship – sharing with others. One of the most valuable things we can share is ourselves: our time, our talents, our energies in serving others in the Body of Christ. "

It takes effort to do this. But riches can come into our life and the lives of everybody around us when we pursue koinonia with Christ at the center.



DAY 7: PRAY THROUGH THE PASSAGE



And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. 18 Truly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. 19 Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. 20 For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them."

21 Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?"

Bubble letters are a simple way where you first draw the letter in pencil, then draw around the letter to make it bigger and rounder.

You can also outline with broken lines for a more modern or crisper feel. This is the style you will have opportunity to use in your Scripture memory review today:

WORD ART DUAL LINED LETTERS

Adding a second line to a letter can be a simple way of dressing it up.

STRAIGHT LINE: Two or Three

Wavy LINE: Two or Three

BROKEN LINE: Two or Three

HORIZONTAL ON TOP: Two or Three

THICK: Two or Three

ON TOP & DOWNSTROKES: Two or Three

Adding a heavy line on top of downstrokes (all the strokes that end at the bottom) is often used in faux calligraphy! This can be a simple way to take your lettering to a whole new level.

You can draw the second line using the same pen or pick up a thicker pen or even use a different color!





WORD ART SHADOWS

Adding shadows to your letters brings additional depth and dimension to them and is not that difficult to do. Picture a candle (or other light source). If it was shining on something where would the shadow be cast?



The main challenge is to be consistent. If you draw the shadow on the right side of the first letter, be sure to stick to that side for the rest of the letters. And if you draw it on the bottom of the first letter, make sure you only add it to the bottom of each letter's strokes.



GATHERED
